## MASQUERADER CAMPAIGN IN KIAMBU COUNTY

On 11th September 2024, the Law Society of Kenya through the Practice Standards Committee convened by Ms. Linda Kiome, Council Member and the LSK Secretariat team, attended a follow-up meeting as scheduled between DCIO- Kingeero and the Legal Representatives of one Gatura Washington Kimani- who had been earlier identified as a masquerader. The masquerader had been summoned to appear before the police personally on the said date for booking. However, the individual failed to turn up and there were further requests from his Representative to be granted another date to present his client. The request was not granted given his absence. Mr. Gatura has been marked as a person absconding prosecution and the police shall give LSK further updates about his arrest.

Additionally, the team acted on a tip-off from Advocates practicing in Kiambu County of an individual Alexander Gitau who was perceived to be offering legal services to members of the Public based on his posts on social media posts. The team in an undercover stint accompanied by the police, visited Mr. Alexander Gitau's office situated at Bishop Njenga House, Thindigua, Kiambu County.

Upon thorough investigation and questioning, it was ascertained that the individual, Alexander Gitau is a Certified Mediator under the Court Annexed Mediation Program. The LSK team cautioned him against portraying himself as an Advocate and was required to take down the offending post where he purported to be in legal practice. He was further advised to adhere to his line of work as a mediator.

The Law Society of Kenya appreciates the membership and the public for their vigilance on individuals purporting to be Advocates and encourages all to continually be on the lookout; and to readily report any such occurrence.

## LSK ATTENDS ORPP LED CONSULTATIVE ENGAGEMENT ON AMENDMENT OF THE POLITICAL PARTIES ACT CAP 7D



The Office of the Registrar of Political Parties (ORPP) with the support of Electoral Law and Governance Institute for Africa (ELGIA) held a consultative meeting on Thursday 12th September 2024 at Four Points By Sheraton Hurlingham in Nairobi with select non-state actors to discuss possible reforms to the Political Parties Act CAP 7D (PPA). The engagement was informed by the ORPP 2022 post-election evaluation exercise that culminated into a report which earmarks various areas for reform.

The meeting realized discussions on amendment of the PPA with respect to various themes including party nominations, inclusive political and electoral processes, coalitions and coalition political parties, institutionalization of political parties, and dispute resolution that is responsive to the Constitution.

Further, the LSK apprised participants of the Political Parties (Amendment) Bill, 2024 which is a product of the National Dialogue Committee. Among other elements, the Bill intends to replace ORPP with a five-member statutory Commission with a membership that is drawn from political parties.

## SPECIALIZED CPD SEMINAR ON AML/CFT/CPF HELD



The Council of the Law Society of Kenya through the Committee on Continuing Professional Development (CCPD) held its 2nd Specialized CPD Seminar on Anti-Money Laundering, Countering the Financing of Terrorism and Countering Proliferation Financing (AML/CFT/CPF) on 10th and 11th of September 2024 at the Panari Hotel.

The two-day seminar focused on enhancing knowledge and compliance regarding Anti-Money Laundering (AML), Countering the Financing of Terrorism (CFT), and Countering Proliferation Financing (CPF) and was attended by legal professionals, regulatory officers, and compliance experts, addressing the roles that lawyers and legal professionals play in facilitating and curbing financial crimes.

The main objectives of the seminar were to:

- Train attendees on the legal and regulatory framework governing AML/CFT/CPF in Kenya.
- Equip participants with practical skills for identifying and assessing risks related to AML/CFT.
- Highlight the importance of Client Due Diligence (CDD), Enhanced Due Diligence (EDD) and how to do it legally for compliance purposes.
- Explain the role of lawyers in AML/CFT compliance, focusing on their responsibility in facilitating, monitoring transactions and reporting suspicious activities.
- Discuss the challenges facing the financial and legal sectors in relation to financial crimes.



In addition, the following speakers made presentation on various topics as highlighted below:

1. Stella Muraguri, Advocate, Managing Partner at MMW Advocates LLP

Topic: The Legal and Regulatory Framework Governing AML/CFT in Kenya

Ms. Muraguri provided a comprehensive analysis of the current legal landscape in Kenya, highlighting the obligations placed on legal professionals under the Proceeds of Crime and Anti-Money Laundering Act (POCAMLA). She emphasized the significance of lawyers adhering to these regulations to ensure ethical practices in their services.

2. Dr. Constance Gikonyo, Senior Lecturer, University of Nairobi, Faculty of Law

Topic: Identifying and Assessing AML/CFT Risks

Dr. Gikonyo's session focused on practical methods for identifying and assessing risks related to money laundering and terrorism financing. She underscored the importance of continuous risk assessment to stay ahead of evolving tactics used by financial criminals.

3. Kananu Mutea, Advocate, Partner at KM Associates

Topic: Client Due Diligence (CDD) and Enhanced Due Diligence (EDD)

Ms. Mutea explored the detailed procedures that legal professionals must follow to ensure proper client verification. She explained how CDD and EDD should be applied depending on the risk profile of clients, stressing the importance of detailed documentation and reporting.

4. Paul P. K. Kamau, Advocate, Managing Partner of P. K. Kamau & Co. Advocates

Topic: The Role of Lawyers in AML/CFT Compliance

Mr. Kamau discussed the unique role that lawyers play as gatekeepers in financial transactions. He highlighted how they can effectively contribute to anti-money laundering efforts by ensuring compliance with the law during their engagements with clients.

5. James Manyonge, Advocate, Head of Legal, Financial Reporting Centre (FRC)  
Topic: Transaction Monitoring and Reporting

Mr. Manyonge presented on the critical importance of monitoring transactions to detect suspicious activity. He emphasized the responsibility of lawyers to report such transactions to the Financial Reporting Centre (FRC), as failure to report may result in legal liabilities.

6. Mercy Buku, Advocate, Legal and Risk Management Consultant in the Digital Financial Services Sector

Topic: Emerging Trends and Challenges in AML/CFT

Ms. Buku shared insights from the regulatory perspective, discussing the latest trends in financial crime and the challenges faced by regulators. He addressed issues such as digital currencies and the complexity they add to AML/CFT efforts.

Key Sessions and Discussions

The seminar consisted of interactive sessions, where participants engaged in discussions and case studies on how to effectively implement AML/CFT policies within their legal practices. Focus was placed on client onboarding processes, enhanced due diligence requirements, and understanding suspicious transaction reports (STRs). Panel discussions also highlighted what legal practitioners can do to stay compliant.

The seminar concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by Aseso Omollo, Council Member and Convener of the Adhoc Committee on AML/CFT. He expressed gratitude to the speakers for their presentations and to the participants for their active engagement. He emphasized the importance of continuous training and knowledge sharing in the fight against financial crimes and encouraged participants to apply the lessons learned to their daily practice.

Conclusion

This two-day seminar provided valuable knowledge and practical insights into Kenya's AML/CFT/CPF framework. With a focus on the responsibilities of legal professionals, the sessions underscored the importance of vigilance, compliance, and ethical practice in curbing financial crimes. The seminar succeeded in equipping participants with the necessary skills to better identify and mitigate risks in their legal practice and to contribute positively to the national and global efforts in fighting financial crime.

## EXTENSION OF DEADLINE-WAIVER ON BACKFEES FOR PRACTICING CERTIFICATE APPLICATIONS

In a bid to encourage members who have ceased to hold a practicing certificate for a period of twelve months or more, renew their practice, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya in its meeting held on 9th September, 2024, resolved to extend the deadline for waiver for payment of backfees for Advocates applying for Practicing Certificates under Section 25(1) (a) of the Advocates Act. The deadline has now been **extended to 30th November 2024.**

In addition, the Council also resolved to extend the waiver to members with outstanding invoices for back fees, subject to taking out 2024 PC. Please note that such applications will be considered on a case-to-case basis.

**N/B:** Kindly note that the waiver does not extend to the Advocates Benevolent Association (ABA) Back Fees and Continuing Professional Development (CPD) fees, where applicable. Additionally, if an advocate applies for the waiver but does not take out their practicing certificate for the year 2024, the waiver shall cease to be applicable.

We encourage all eligible members to take advantage of the waiver through issuance of a Notice of Intention to practice under Section 25 (1) (a) of the Advocates Act.

# SUPREME COURT @12 CONFERENCE CALL FOR PAPERS

The Supreme Court of Kenya is established under Article 163(1) of the Constitution as the apex Court in Kenya. The inaugural bench of the Supreme Court was appointed on 16<sup>th</sup> June, 2011 and assumed office on 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2011. Since its establishment, the Court has been instrumental in asserting the supremacy of the Constitution and sovereignty of the people of Kenya; developing rich jurisprudence which not only settles legal issues but also guides the courts below it; and enhancing access to justice in line with its objectives.

In commemorating its 12<sup>th</sup> year anniversary, the Supreme Court will hold a conference whose main objective is to demystify the Court as well as introspect and reflect on its performance since inception. In line with the Judiciary's blueprint of 'Social Transformation through Access to Justice' (STAJ), and the Court's Strategic Plan 2020-2024, the Court recognises the integral role that its stakeholders play in the achievement of its mandate. Consequently, the Supreme Court calls for papers anchored on the theme '**Introspecting and Reflecting on the Supreme Court's Jurisprudence: 12 Years of Defending the Constitution.**'

The papers submitted may include any of the following sub-themes of the said conference:

- The Jurisprudence of the Supreme Court of Kenya*
- The Milestones, challenges and opportunities in the evolution of the Supreme Court of Kenya*
- Judicial independence, accountability and the Supreme Court of Kenya.*
- Global Traditions, Practice and Comparative experiences of apex Courts*
- Technology and the Supreme Court.*

### Submission Guidelines
