LSK CONTINUING PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT (CPD) COMPLIANCE (2024)

The Law Society of Kenya (LSK) encourages members to comply with The Legal Notice No. 43 - The Advocates (Continuing Professional Development) Rules, 2014.

The Rules provides as follows:

I) "CPD year" means a calendar year beginning on the 1st January and ending on the 31st December;

II) Rule 4: In each CPD year-

(a) An advocate shall participate in or attend approved events at which that advocate shall accrue a minimum of five units except where that advocate has been exempted in part or in whole;

(b) If an advocate accrues more than five (5) units, the excess number of units shall not be carried over to the next CPD year by that advocate

(d) In each CPD year, if an advocate fails to accrue five units, that advocate may make up the difference in the period between the 1st January and the 31st January of the next CPD year.

III) Rule 9: If an advocate fails to comply with these Rules-

(a) The Council shall notify the advocate in writing of the failure; and;

(b) The Council may require the advocate to inform the Council in writing within fourteen days of the Council's notice of that advocate's proposal to comply with these Rules.

Applications for Practicing Certificates will be completed online, with documents uploaded digitally. Once processed, the Practicing Certificates will be auto generated, signed and made available on the LSK member's portal for printing.

This process applies to members who meet the following conditions:

- 1. Have taken out a Practising Certificate for the year 2024.

Members with open disciplinary cases will be required to seek approval/ clearance from the Secretariat by emailing <u>compliance@lsk.or.ke</u>.





PRIVILEGES AND IMMUNITIES: WHAT ARE THEY?

Two weeks ago, the High Court of Kenya Suspended the privileges and Immunities status granted to the Gates Foundation. It is this restriction that many have been exploring the diplomatic provision of privileges and immunities. Privileges and immunities are a special topic within the larger subject of international institutional law. International organizations, their officials, and representatives of their member states enjoy certain privileges and immunities in order to carry out their functions.

Privileges and immunities are granted to different categories: an organization e.g. inviolability of the premises and archives: representatives of member states e.g. immunity from arrest for speech or acts carried out in their official capacity: Secretariat officials e.g. immunity from arrest for speech or acts carried out in their official capacity. The US Supreme Court Justice Bushrod Washington, George Washington's surmised the concepts in the following words, "privileges and immunities" are rights that (1) "are, in their nature, fundamental": (2) "belong, of right, to the citizens of all free governments"; and (3) can be found in the positive law in the states, which included common law rights. Justice Washington then proceeded to list some examples, such as the rights to travel, to claim the writ of habeas corpus, to maintain lawsuits, and others. In other words, privileges exempt diplomats from some laws (e.g., the law that all citizens should pay taxes) but not all laws (e.g., the law that theft is prohibited). Immunities, in contrast, prevent legal processes against diplomats. This distinction is very practical. If a diplomat commits theft and avoids a court trial due to immunity, it does not mean that they cannot be prosecuted later on (e.g., during a subsequent visit to the country after the expiry of diplomatic immunity).

Notably, modern diplomacy grew after the Renaissance. In fact, since the first ministry of foreign affairs was introduced in France in 1626 countries established more regular and organised interactions through diplomatic missions. The practice of diplomacy led to the Congress of Vienna in 1815, which established an institutional framework for modern diplomacy. The Congress of Vienna established classes of diplomatic representation (ambassadors and papal legates, minister's plenipotentiary, ministers' resident, and chargés d'affairs). It also introduced diplomatic precedence, a rank depending on the class of diplomatic representative and the date at which an envoy presented his letters of credence. Legally speaking, the Congress codified customary diplomatic law. Many institutions from the Congress of Vienna were included in the Vienna Convention on Diplomatic Relations of 1961, which is the main source of current diplomatic law.

The term diplomatic immunity is popularly, and erroneously, understood to refer to special protections afforded all employees of foreign governments who are present in foreign missions. However, this should be understood more broadly.

While customary international law continues to refine the concepts of diplomatic and consular immunity, the basic rules are currently embodied in international treaties which are applied by States within their jurisdiction. Diplomatic immunity is not intended to serve as a license for persons to flout the law and purposely avoid liability for their actions. The purpose of these privileges and immunities #Wakilis is not to benefit individuals but to ensure the efficient and effective performance of their official missions on behalf of their governments and in due regard to the host nations rules and procedures. This being a good governance requirement that we should continue to advance.
