PRACTICE CORNER

PROTECTING THE PROFESSION: COUNCIL'S EFFORTS TO ENHANCE ADVOCATE WELFARE AND PRACTICE CONDITIONS

Upon assuming office in March 2026, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya prioritized member welfare as a central part of its leadership agenda. It emphasized that welfare goes beyond remuneration to include professional dignity, safety, fair treatment within justice institutions, efficient court systems, and a supportive environment for legal practice.

In its inaugural statement, the Council pledged to protect advocates from intimidation, harassment, and insecurity. It also committed to strengthening accountability within justice sector institutions, ensuring that advocates can practice in an environment that respects their rights and professional standing.

Guided by this vision, the Council initiated structured engagements with the Judiciary and other stakeholders. These efforts aim to address long-standing challenges faced by advocates across the country, reinforcing the Society's role as a defender of its members and a champion for reforms in the justice sector.

On 27th April, 2026, shortly after assuming office, the Council paid a courtesy call to the Honourable Chief Justice and President of the Supreme Court of Kenya, Hon. Justice Martha Koome, EGH, and presented a comprehensive memorandum on matters affecting advocates and the administration of justice.

Key Issues Raised by the Council

- Judicial staffing shortages causing delays and backlog
- Registry inefficiencies affecting service delivery
- Delays in hearings, rulings, judgments, and release of court-deposited funds
- Judicial integrity, accountability, and professional standards
- Small Claims Court operations and costs
- Court-Annexed Mediation reforms
- Welfare and career progression of advocates serving within the Judiciary
- Need for structured engagement between the Bench and the Bar

Key Commitments from the Judiciary

I. Institutionalised Engagement Framework

The Judiciary committed to strengthening structured and predictable engagement mechanisms with the Law Society of Kenya to ensure continuous dialogue on issues affecting court users and legal practitioners.

II. Advocate Feedback Mechanisms

Agreement was reached on the development and strengthening of formal feedback channels through which advocates may raise concerns relating to judicial conduct, registry performance, and service delivery efficiency.

III. Enhanced Transparency in Administrative Actions

The Judiciary undertook to improve openness and communication in administrative decisions, including judicial postings, transfers, and related human resource actions that affect court operations.

IV. Small Claims Court Reform Consultation

The Chief Justice's response affirmed ongoing consultation with stakeholders, including the LSK, in the refinement and operational strengthening of the Small Claims Court framework.

V. Court-Annexed Mediation (CAM) and Practitioner Inclusion

The Judiciary committed to sustained engagement on Court-Annexed Mediation, with a focus on expanding and clarifying the role of advocates within mediation processes.

VI. Recognition of Legal Researchers and Advocates within the Judiciary

The response acknowledged concerns regarding advocates and legal researchers serving within the Judiciary, with a commitment to further internal review and structured dialogue on their working conditions and professional progression.

Impact on Advocates and the Practice of Law

- Promotion of institutionalised accountability and enhanced collaboration between the Judiciary and the LSK.
- Establishment of clear and direct channels through which advocates can raise practice-related concerns.
- Promotion of transparency in judicial administration and strengthened stakeholder participation in ongoing justice sector reforms.
- Enhanced responsiveness within the justice system.
- Affirmation of shared commitment to the efficient, accessible, and professional delivery of justice.



LSK- FRC ENGAGEMENT

The LSK President, Charles Kanjama, SC, and the Council attended a 3- day high-level engagement with the Financial Reporting Centre (FRC) on strengthening the legal profession's response to Anti-Money Laundering, Countering the Financing of Terrorism and Countering Proliferation Financing (AML/CFT/CPF) obligations. As the designated Self-Regulatory Body for advocates under POCAMLA, LSK continues to build the institutional capacity, regulatory frameworks and member support mechanisms necessary to promote compliance while safeguarding the independence, integrity and confidentiality of the legal profession. The engagement is focused on developing practical compliance frameworks, strengthening member awareness and support, promoting risk-based supervision, and ensuring that advocates and law firms are equipped to meet regulatory requirements in a manner that is proportionate, practical and responsive to the realities of legal practice. Through these efforts, Council seeks to reduce compliance uncertainty for advocates, enhance public confidence in the profession, and position LSK to better support members as the AML/CFT/CPF framework continues to evolve.





TRAINING ON SEXUAL AND GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE AND FORENSIC EVIDENCE HANDLING AND LEGAL AID CLINIC

In line with our mandate, the Law Society of Kenya has partnered with Physicians for Human Rights-Kenya (PHR-K), a non-governmental organization working at the intersection of medicine, science, and law to advance justice and human rights, to conduct a training for Advocates, on the Management of Forensic Evidence in Sexual and Gender Based Violence Cases that happened on 9th and 10th June 2026. The training opened with a powerful first day focused on one goal, making SGBV case management more forensic, medical and survivor-centered; putting survivors at the center, while tightening the link between forensic evidence and legal processes. Experts from law, medicine, forensics and human rights broke down the realities of SGBV and conflict related sexual violence through a human rights lens. The message was clear, accountability and access to justice, only works when the approach is survivor-centered.

On day 2, another solid day of practical learning and peer exchange. Ms. Suzanne Kidenda of Physicians for Human Rights-Kenya, led a deep dive into trauma-informed practice. Participants examined how to design safer, more responsive systems that protect survivor's dignity and autonomy, while cutting the risk of re-traumatization at every stage of the process. Hon. Harrison Adika, Senior Principal Magistrate at Engineer Law Courts, ran a practical session on interviewing survivors, children and expert witnesses. The emphasis was on sensitive, effective questioning that yields credible testimony with zero compromise on professionalism.

Ms. Stella Bosibori of the Office of the Director of Public Prosecutions walked through the prosecutor's role in sexual and Gender based violence cases. The session mapped how to build strong cases, coordinate with investigators, evaluate evidence and keep the pursuit of justice on track from day one to verdict. Ms. Isabella Obara Nabwire Advocate of Nabwire Obara and Company Advocates, closed the day by unpacking victim representation under the Victim Protection Act. Ms. Nabwire led the discussion on the role of the victim Counsel throughout the prosecution, covering legal protections available to survivors and elucidating how meaningful participation by counsel, can change outcomes in criminal proceedings.





COURTESY CALL ON IEBC KENYA

On 9th June 2026, the Law Society of Kenya Council, led by the President, Mr. Charles Kanjama, SC, paid a courtesy call on the IEBC Kenya, whose delegation was led by the Chairperson, Mr. Erastus Edung EtheKon. The engagement focused on practical areas of collaboration ahead of the 2027 General Election, including preparedness, electoral dispute resolution, election observation, legal reform, and the structured participation of advocates in strengthening Kenya's electoral processes. IEBC Kenya acknowledged LSK as a key legal and governance stakeholder and invited deeper collaboration in voter and stakeholder education, preventive compliance, and the training of political parties, candidates, agents and advocates on electoral law and dispute-resolution processes. For LSK members, the Council specifically pushed for a more visible and meaningful role for advocates in the electoral cycle, beyond post-election litigation. The discussions opened space for advocates to be trained and accredited as election observers, to support political parties and candidates in compliance before disputes arise, to participate in electoral dispute resolution, and to contribute to priority legal reforms touching on results transmission, campaign financing, early campaigns, the Electoral Code of Conduct, academic qualifications, Chapter Six integrity issues, recall, the two-thirds gender rule and referendum law. LSK will continue engaging IEBC so that members are not spectators in the 2027 electoral process but active professional actors in safeguarding legality, credibility, and public confidence in elections.





RELEASE OF CHIEF JUSTICE EMERITUS DAVID MARAGA

Following the arrest of the Chief Justice Emeritus and 8 others on 8th June 2026, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya mobilised a legal team to secure their release and confirms that Chief Justice Emeritus David Maraga, together with 8 activists, were released from Lang'ata Police Station on free bond, without any charges, and would report back to the police in two weeks.

This follows the intervention of LSK leadership, including President, Charles Kanjama, SC, Vice President, Teresia Wavinya, Council Members Titus Mukanzi, Hiram Morio, Eyase Vivian and other Members of LSK in attending at Lang'ata Police Station to secure their release and safeguard their constitutional rights.

The Law Society of Kenya reiterates its strong condemnation of the arrest of Chief Justice Emeritus David Maraga and fellow environmental activists who were peacefully protesting the irregular allocation of 76 acres of Nairobi National Park. The arrest, for exercising rights under Article 37 of the Constitution, remains deeply troubling and an affront to the civic space guaranteed by the Constitution.





PRESENTATION OF THE SOCIETY'S MEMORANDUM ON THE LAW OF CONTRACT (AMENDMENT) BILL, 2025.

On 9th June 2026, the President of the Law Society of Kenya, Charles Kanjama, SC, accompanied by Ms. Ruth Nyaberi, Deputy CEO and Head of Parliamentary Affairs and Legislation Directorate, appeared before the Justice and Legal Affairs Committee (JLAC) of the National Assembly to present the Society's memorandum on the Law of Contract (Amendment) Bill, 2025. LSK expressed its support for the Bill in principle while proposing targeted amendments directed at strengthening consumer protection, enhancing accountability in contractual relationships and ensuring consistency with constitutional values and principles. The Society equally emphasized the need of balancing consumer protection imperatives with contractual certainty and the need for commercial flexibility that sustains a vibrant economy. The Society further recommended that Kenya's amendment process consciously draws from well-developed jurisprudence and legal framework on unconscionable and unfair contractual terms. During the engagement, the President expressed the society's desire to maintain and deepen its collaborative relationship with the Committee on matters relating to legislative development, law reform and the administration of justice.

Greetings from the LSK Chairs Caucus.

We write to you regards issues affecting advocates within the Law Society of Kenya with a view to improve the administration of justice and enhance service delivery.

(A). The following are key issues of concern in Nairobi and Kiambu Counties: -

1. Background

LSK Nairobi Branch is a statutory Branch of the Law Society of Kenya, tasked with improving the standards and conditions of legal practice in Nairobi and Kiambu Counties. We represent about 80% of the Lawyers in Kenya who make up to 14,000 active Advocates.

The Branch is committed to creating an enabling and responsive environment that addresses the practice and welfare needs of Advocates within the Nairobi and Kiambu counties. To enhance the practice environment, we actively collaborate with stakeholders such as the Judiciary to organize Bar-Bench Committee meetings, where the Bar and the Bench can collectively address issues affecting legal practice before various Courts within our jurisdiction.

2. Cooperative Dialogue and Stakeholder Engagement

One of the key pillars of the Social Transformation through Access to Justice Blueprint is Cooperative Dialogue, which envisions a justice system that fosters collaboration, open communication, and the active inclusion of diverse stakeholders in shaping and implementing its policies and practices. In this regard, the LSK Nairobi Branch currently has several functioning Bar-Bench Committees from the Supreme Court, Court of Appeal, all the Divisions of the Milimani High Court, Magistrates Courts to the various Tribunals.

Over the last couple of months, the Branch Council has paid courtesy calls on court stations within its jurisdiction i.e Nairobi and Kiambu counties, in furtherance of the Branch's mandate to improve legal practice conditions within the two counties. 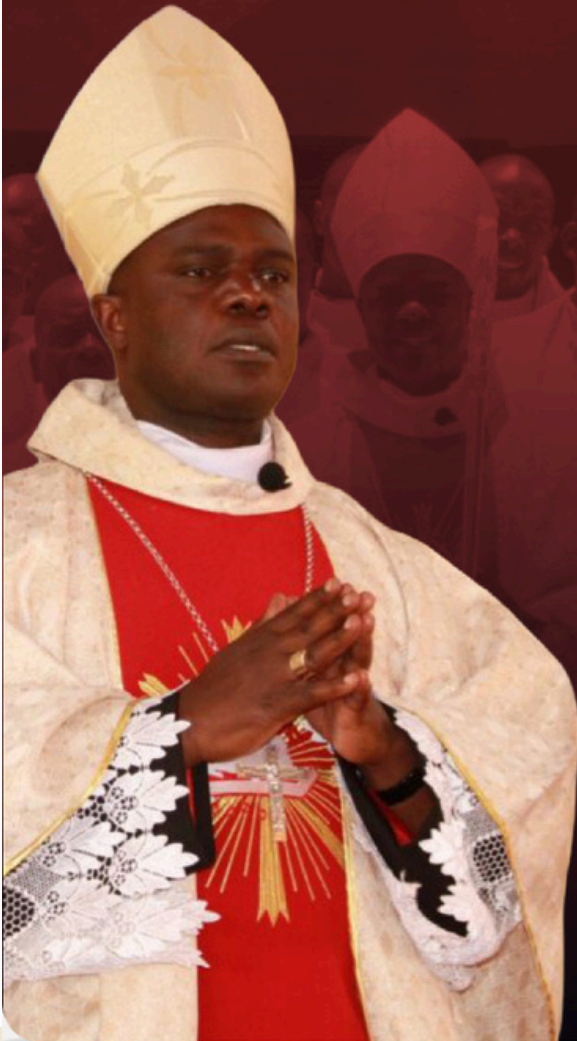

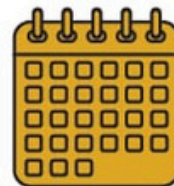
