PRESIDENT'S WEEKLY MESSAGE: RECLAIMING & REFINING OUR PRACTICE SPACE

In the past few weeks, I've attended a launch of Tharaka University Law School in Marimanti and a graduation ceremony for Umma University, including graduates of Law and Sharia Studies, in Kajiado. We have engaged professional bodies seeking to collaborate with LSK, including Estate Agents and Public Relations Professionals. We've engaged Constitutional Commissions and public agencies like the Ombudsman (Commission on Administrative Justice), Kenya Law Reform Commission and National Council for Law Reporting. We've interacted with public officers in our legal-justice ecosystem including the Chief Justice, the Registrar, Judiciary Automation, the Registrar Tribunals, and the Chief Land Registrar.

In all our various engagements, we've consistently pursued the refining & expansion of our legal practice space. We've encountered tremendous opportunities for expansion of legal practice space, signs of dynamism, avenues for growth and reasons for optimism. Side by side, we've also encountered an insidious scepticism in the role of lawyers, a pervasive sentiment in some circles that sees lawyers as an irritant or obstacle to access to justice. This sentiment, that is hostile to the dignity of the lawyer, is one we have resolved to expose and to tackle. Equally, we've resolved to jointly engage our members and stakeholders to deal with the internal challenges we face as a profession, including instances of toxic work environment, workplace bullying and harassment, and elevated work-related stress.

Next week, we gather together for the annual LSK Justice Games, this year co-hosted with LSK Nairobi Branch. Let's all gather together in a social and relaxed environment, interact and engage, and share ideas and experiences as we work to transform the legal profession.

PRACTICE CORNER

PROTECTING THE PROFESSION: COUNCIL'S EFFORTS TO ENHANCE ADVOCATE WELFARE AND PRACTICE CONDITIONS

Upon assuming office in March 2026, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya prioritized member welfare as a central part of its leadership agenda. It emphasized that welfare goes beyond remuneration to include professional dignity, safety, fair treatment within justice institutions, efficient court systems, and a supportive environment for legal practice.

In its inaugural statement, the Council pledged to protect advocates from intimidation, harassment, and insecurity. It also committed to strengthening accountability within justice sector institutions, ensuring that advocates can practice in an environment that respects their rights and professional standing.

Guided by this vision, the Council initiated structured engagements with the Judiciary and other stakeholders. These efforts aim to address long-standing challenges faced by advocates across the country, reinforcing the Society's role as a defender of its members and a champion for reforms in the justice sector.

On 27th April, 2026, shortly after assuming office, the Council paid a courtesy call to the Honourable Chief Justice and President of the Supreme Court of Kenya, Hon. Justice Martha Koome, EGH, and presented a comprehensive memorandum on matters affecting advocates and the administration of justice.

Key Issues Raised by the Council

- Judicial staffing shortages causing delays and backlog
- Registry inefficiencies affecting service delivery
- Delays in hearings, rulings, judgments, and release of court-deposited funds
- Judicial integrity, accountability, and professional standards
- Small Claims Court operations and costs
- Court-Annexed Mediation reforms
- Welfare and career progression of advocates serving within the Judiciary
- Need for structured engagement between the Bench and the Bar

Key Commitments from the Judiciary

I. Institutionalised Engagement Framework

The Judiciary committed to strengthening structured and predictable engagement mechanisms with the Law Society of Kenya to ensure continuous dialogue on issues affecting court users and legal practitioners.

II. Advocate Feedback Mechanisms

Agreement was reached on the development and strengthening of formal feedback channels through which advocates may raise concerns relating to judicial conduct, registry performance, and service delivery efficiency.

III. Enhanced Transparency in Administrative Actions

The Judiciary undertook to improve openness and communication in administrative decisions, including judicial postings, transfers, and related human resource actions that affect court operations.

IV. Small Claims Court Reform Consultation

The Chief Justice's response affirmed ongoing consultation with stakeholders, including the LSK, in the refinement and operational strengthening of the Small Claims Court framework.

V. Court-Annexed Mediation (CAM) and Practitioner Inclusion

The Judiciary committed to sustained engagement on Court-Annexed Mediation, with a focus on expanding and clarifying the role of advocates within mediation processes.

VI. Recognition of Legal Researchers and Advocates within the Judiciary

The response acknowledged concerns regarding advocates and legal researchers serving within the Judiciary, with a commitment to further internal review and structured dialogue on their working conditions and professional progression.

Impact on Advocates and the Practice of Law

- Promotion of institutionalised accountability and enhanced collaboration between the Judiciary and the LSK.
- Establishment of clear and direct channels through which advocates can raise practice-related concerns.
- Promotion of transparency in judicial administration and strengthened stakeholder participation in ongoing justice sector reforms.
- Enhanced responsiveness within the justice system.
- Affirmation of shared commitment to the efficient, accessible, and professional delivery of justice.



LSK PAYS COURTESY CALL ON THE KLRC



On 18th June 2026, the Law Society of Kenya (LSK) today held a courtesy call and consultative engagement with the Kenya Law Reform Commission (KLRC). The meeting focused on strengthening constitutional implementation and advancing law reform in Kenya.

The engagement was led by LSK President Charles Kanjama, SC, and Vice President Teresia Wavinya, and attended by KLRC Chairperson Ms Christine Agimba, SC, and Acting CEO Mr James Nombi, alongside representatives from both institutions. The meeting highlighted the importance of sustained institutional collaboration in advancing legal reforms that respond to Kenya's evolving constitutional and societal needs.

Key discussion areas included:

- Constitutional implementation gaps, including pending constitutional legislation, enforcement of the two-thirds gender rule, and Bill of Rights compliance review.
- Comprehensive law reform, including review of outdated statutes, family laws, penalty frameworks, and emerging areas such as AI, data protection, and digital economy regulation.

- Future of legal services, with emphasis on CPD collaboration, county legal capacity building, and adaptation to digital justice systems.
- Pre-legislative scrutiny & regulatory impact assessments to improve quality of legislation and constitutional compliance.
- Access to justice reforms, including strengthening legal aid, penal reform, prison decongestion, and expanded pro bono reporting.

The meeting also proposed a structured partnership framework including an LSK- A KLRC MOU, a Joint Technical Committee, and an annual high-level review mechanism to guide sustained collaboration. Both institutions underscored that Kenya's constitutional journey remains ongoing, and that coordinated institutional effort is key to delivering meaningful, people-centered legal reform towards a modern, responsive, and constitutionally anchored legal system that strengthens the rule of law and enhances access to justice.

LSK HOSTS SPECIALIZED CPD SEMINAR ON FAMILY LAW IN NAIROBI

The Law Society of Kenya (LSK) President, Charles Kanjama, SC, officially opened the third LSK Specialized Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Seminar on Family Law on Wednesday 17th June 2026, at Emara Ole-Sereni Hotel, Nairobi. Convened under the theme “Global Perspectives, Local Solutions,” the three-day seminar brought together legal practitioners to interrogate contemporary family law issues while drawing lessons from global best practices applicable to the local context.

In his opening remarks, the President reaffirmed the Council’s commitment to strengthening niche practice areas and enhancing the profession. He emphasized the Council’s dedication to expanding the number of Advocate Mediators under the Court Annexed Mediation (CAM) framework, to better serve clients who prefer resolving disputes through mediation.

The seminar featured a rich program of presentations and discussions. On the first day, Ms. Christine Kungu, Chairperson of FIDA Kenya, spoke on “Entrenching Mediation in Family Law,” while Ms. Gemma Lindfield, Barrister and Arbitrator from the United Kingdom, shared insights on family arbitration practice. Ms. Samantha Masengeli, Advocate, presented on “Surrogacy at Crossroads: Human Dignity, Exploitation Risks & The Legal Shift Toward Prohibition.” Other speakers included Muthoni Gachara, LSK Council Member, Eric Kivuva, LSK Nairobi Branch Chair and Ondati Mogaka, CPD Committee Member.

Participants also engaged in robust discussions on the evolving landscape of trust law and its application within family law practice. Comparative perspectives were provided by Dianah Mureithi, Advocate, and Ms. Lindfield, who highlighted emerging trends and best practices in trust and estate planning across jurisdictions.

Day three continued with equally insightful sessions, including a presentation by Hon. Lady Justice Caroline Kendagor of the High Court on “Matrimonial Property Rights in Succession.”

Her discourse examined the intersection between matrimonial property and succession law, offering valuable judicial perspectives on the protection and distribution of property rights within families. The session was moderated by Anita Masaki, who facilitated meaningful engagement among participants.

The seminar has provided a dynamic platform for learning, knowledge exchange, and professional engagement. Upon completion of the program, participants were awarded four (4) CPD Units in recognition of their commitment to continuous learning and excellence in legal practice.

THE STATUS OF THE NATIONAL SOCIAL SECURITY FUND ACT, 2013 AND THE RULE OF LAW IMPERATIVES

The Law Society of Kenya (LSK), pursuant to its statutory mandate, issues this statement to provide clarity regarding the legal position of the National Social Security Fund Act, 2013 following the ruling of the Court of Appeal delivered on 29th May 2026.

BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

The constitutionality of the NSSF Act, 2013 has been the subject of litigation since 2014. In Nairobi ELRC Petition No. 38 of 2014, the Employment and Labour Relations Court (ELRC) declared various provisions of the Act unconstitutional and invalid. On 3rd February 2023, the Court of Appeal set aside this judgment on jurisdictional grounds, rendering the Act operational.

However, on 21st February 2024, the Supreme Court overturned the Court of Appeal's decision, holding that the ELRC possessed jurisdiction to hear the dispute, and remitted the matter to the Court of Appeal for determination of the substantive merits. The consequence was that the Court of Appeal's judgment ceased to have legal effect, restoring the legal force of the ELRC judgment pending the substantive appeal.

18 June 2026 - The High Court today heard oral highlights of submissions in the contempt application relating to alleged non-compliance with conservatory orders restraining the proposed Ebola facility at Laikipia Air Base. The 2nd Petitioner, LSK, was represented by Wycklife Oyoo, Jacjohn Owino, Kiragu Wathuta and Wangari Kagai, while 1st Petitioner, Katiba Institute, was represented by Joshua Malidzo Nyawa.

The Petitioners submitted that there is an admission by CS Health of ongoing construction, demonstrating non-compliance with express court orders. They further emphasized that compliance must be real and demonstrable, noting that no substantive documents have been supplied as directed and that court orders cannot be applied selectively. LSK further urged the Court to cite the Cabinet Secretary for Health for contempt and summon him in person to explain the continued activities at Laikipia Air Base.

The Respondents argued that the Court orders only restrained the Kenya - USA arrangement, which they stated has since been suspended, and that ongoing activity relates to independent public health preparedness within the Constitution and the Public Health Act. They further challenged reliance on media reports and satellite imagery, arguing that such materials lack probative value.

The court will rule on Monday **22 June 2026** on whether the Respondents have complied with the Court's orders in substance or whether the ongoing activities amount to disobedience with court orders.

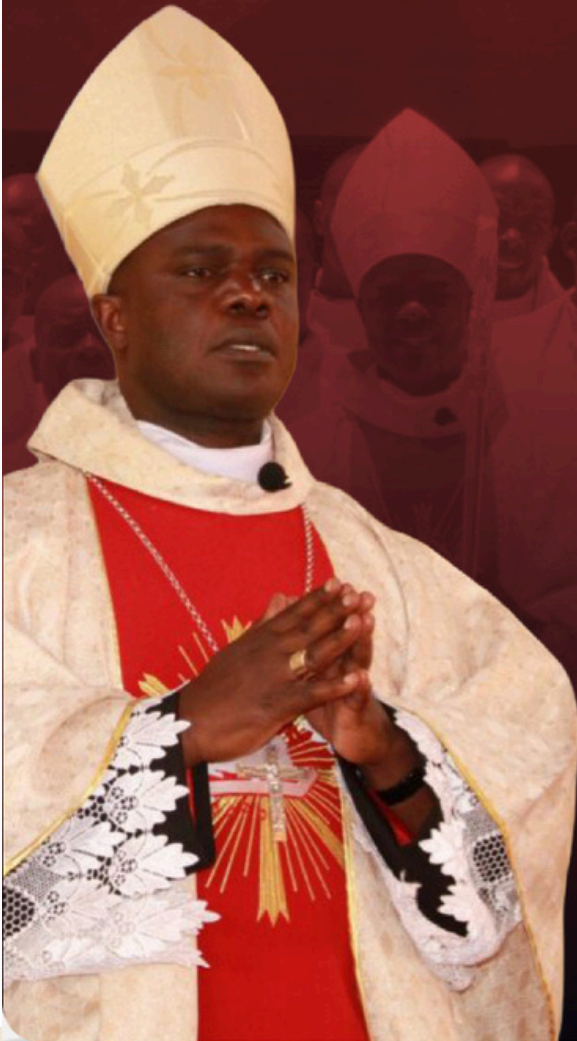

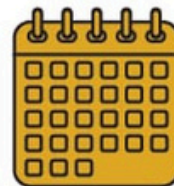
