PRESIDENT'S WEEKLY MESSAGE:

A LEGAL PROFESSION ON THE MOVE.

Two years ago, during the LSK Annual Conference in Diani, South Coast, the late Pheroze Nowrojee SC gave a keynote address to the assembled lawyers gathered in plenary session. That keynote speech, where he also launched his book, "Practising a Noble Profession", turned out to be his last public address to the Bar. He memorably referred to the dignity of the legal profession by asserting, quite justifiably, that the Advocate occupies & discharges a Constitutional office under the Constitution of Kenya 2010. The Advocate is both an officer of the Court and, under the Katiba, a Constitutional office holder. This is the vision that is driving the ongoing progress and transformation of the legal profession.

We live and practise law in exciting times, when the potential of the Law, as well as the Lawyer, keeps expanding. We witness a profession that is clearly on the move, to impact, affect & transform all sectors of Society.

In the past one week, LSK was represented in Uganda during the bail application of senior lawyer Erias Lukwago who acts for Kizza Besigye in his treason trial; we also, as lead of the EALS delegation, participated in the Bar Bench mediation ongoing there, and attended the official launch of ULS at 70, and opening of the 6-storey ULS House. LSK leadership also attended LSK-Judiciary Meetings in Nairobi and Naivasha respectively to engage and set roadmaps on issues of court-annexed mediation and Judiciary pro-bono & pauper briefs scheme respectively. We engaged the Auctioneers Licensing Board on proposals to reform & improve the sector. The LSK Council had meetings with the Inspector General of Police and the Attorney General respectively where we championed lawyers' practice issues. We also requested both the IG & AG to set up structured liaison committees for lawyers to regularly engage the AG & Police in their internal structures respectively, so as to secure continued interaction, similar to the

Bar-Bench Committees we set up with the Judiciary a decade ago. We urged the development of a roadmap to allow State Counsel to be recognised as special active members of LSK after we agree on the payable fee, in line with the LSK Act & Regulations. We also pushed for better terms of service for lawyers in the public sector.

On Saturday, we participated in the largest Justice Games ever in terms of attendance, where more than 50 teams registered for football, in addition to participation in other sports & games. PRACTICE CORNER

PROTECTING THE PROFESSION: COUNCIL'S EFFORTS TO ENHANCE ADVOCATE WELFARE AND PRACTICE CONDITIONS

Upon assuming office in March 2026, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya prioritized member welfare as a central part of its leadership agenda. It emphasized that welfare goes beyond remuneration to include professional dignity, safety, fair treatment within justice institutions, efficient court systems, and a supportive environment for legal practice.

In its inaugural statement, the Council pledged to protect advocates from intimidation, harassment, and insecurity. It also committed to strengthening accountability within justice sector institutions, ensuring that advocates can practice in an environment that respects their rights and professional standing.

Guided by this vision, the Council initiated structured engagements with the Judiciary and other stakeholders. These efforts aim to address long-standing challenges faced by advocates across the country, reinforcing the Society's role as a defender of its members and a champion for reforms in the justice sector.

On 27th April, 2026, shortly after assuming office, the Council paid a courtesy call to the Honourable Chief Justice and President of the Supreme Court of Kenya, Hon. Justice Martha Koome, EGH, and presented a comprehensive memorandum on matters affecting advocates and the administration of justice.

Key Issues Raised by the Council

- Judicial staffing shortages causing delays and backlog
- Registry inefficiencies affecting service delivery
- Delays in hearings, rulings, judgments, and release of court-deposited funds
- Judicial integrity, accountability, and professional standards
- Small Claims Court operations and costs
- Court-Annexed Mediation reforms
- Welfare and career progression of advocates serving within the Judiciary
- Need for structured engagement between the Bench and the Bar

Key Commitments from the Judiciary

I. Institutionalised Engagement Framework

The Judiciary committed to strengthening structured and predictable engagement mechanisms with the Law Society of Kenya to ensure continuous dialogue on issues affecting court users and legal practitioners.

II. Advocate Feedback Mechanisms

Agreement was reached on the development and strengthening of formal feedback channels through which advocates may raise concerns relating to judicial conduct, registry performance, and service delivery efficiency.

III. Enhanced Transparency in Administrative Actions

The Judiciary undertook to improve openness and communication in administrative decisions, including judicial postings, transfers, and related human resource actions that affect court operations.

IV. Small Claims Court Reform Consultation

The Chief Justice's response affirmed ongoing consultation with stakeholders, including the LSK, in the refinement and operational strengthening of the Small Claims Court framework.

V. Court-Annexed Mediation (CAM) and Practitioner Inclusion

The Judiciary committed to sustained engagement on Court-Annexed Mediation, with a focus on expanding and clarifying the role of advocates within mediation processes.

VI. Recognition of Legal Researchers and Advocates within the Judiciary

The response acknowledged concerns regarding advocates and legal researchers serving within the Judiciary, with a commitment to further internal review and structured dialogue on their working conditions and professional progression.

Impact on Advocates and the Practice of Law

- Promotion of institutionalised accountability and enhanced collaboration between the Judiciary and the LSK.
- Establishment of clear and direct channels through which advocates can raise practice-related concerns.
- Promotion of transparency in judicial administration and strengthened stakeholder participation in ongoing justice sector reforms.
- Enhanced responsiveness within the justice system.
- Affirmation of shared commitment to the efficient, accessible, and professional delivery of justice.



COURTESY CALL ON THE ATTORNEY GENERAL

On 26th June 2026, the Attorney General Hon. Dorcas Oduor, EGH, hosted Council Members of the Law Society of Kenya (LSK), led by its President, Charles Kanjama SC, who paid a courtesy call at the Office of the Attorney General. The visit provided an opportunity for the two institutions to reaffirm their shared commitment to upholding the rule of law, constitutionalism, and the effective administration of justice. During the meeting, discussions focused on matters of mutual interest, including strengthening collaboration between the Office of the Attorney General and the Law Society of Kenya in advancing legal and institutional reforms, promoting access to justice, and enhancing the delivery of legal services to the public. The engagement also underscored the importance of continued dialogue and cooperation in addressing emerging legal and governance issues affecting the country. The Attorney General welcomed the delegation and reiterated the Office's commitment to fostering constructive partnerships with key stakeholders in the justice sector. She noted that sustained collaboration between the Office of the Attorney General and the Law Society of Kenya is essential in promoting good governance, safeguarding the rule of law, and supporting the administration of justice in Kenya. The meeting concluded with both parties expressing their commitment to maintaining close engagement and working together to strengthen Kenya's legal and justice system for the benefit of all citizens.





COURTESY CALL ON THE INSPECTOR GENERAL OF POLICE,

The Law Society of Kenya (LSK) Council on 26th June 2026, paid a courtesy call on the Inspector General of Police, Douglas Kanja, MGH, CBS, OGW to discuss matters of mutual concern affecting the administration of justice, the rule of law, and the legal profession. The Council, led by LSK President Charles Kanjama, SC, formally presented a protest note expressing the Society's concerns regarding the handling of yesterday's protests by security forces. The engagement provided an opportunity to raise issues relating to the protection of constitutional rights, accountability, and the need for policing that upholds the rule of law and respects fundamental freedoms. The delegation comprised LSK President Charles Kanjama, SC, Council Members Vivian Eyase, Titus Mukanzi, Aseso Omollo, and Effie Sheila, together with LSK Chief Executive Officer Florence Muturi. The Law Society of Kenya remains committed to constructive engagement with state institutions in advancing justice, constitutionalism, and the protection of the rights and freedoms of all Kenyans.





LAW SOCIETY OF KENYA REVIEWS DRAFT COURT-ANNEXED MEDIATION ROADMAP WITH JUDICIARY

The Law Society of Kenya, led by its President, Charles Kanjama, SC, participated in a high-level consultative meeting with the Judiciary's Steering Committee on Mediation to review the draft implementation roadmap for the Court-Annexed Mediation Programme.

The meeting formed part of the ongoing collaboration between the Judiciary and the Law Society of Kenya following the joint engagements held earlier this year to address operational and policy issues affecting Court-Annexed Mediation.

The draft roadmap proposes practical interventions across key thematic areas, including legal and policy reforms, mediator accreditation, advocate participation, professional development, public sensitisation, institutional strengthening, transparent case referral mechanisms, data management, monitoring and stakeholder collaboration.

During the discussions, the Law Society reiterated the importance of expediting the accreditation of trained advocate mediators, strengthening institutional cooperation, enhancing public confidence in mediation, safeguarding party autonomy and ensuring that the Court-Annexed Mediation Programme continues to develop in a manner that promotes professionalism, efficiency and access to justice.

The engagement reaffirmed the shared commitment of the Judiciary and the Law Society of Kenya to building a stronger, more responsive and more effective mediation framework for the benefit of court users and the wider justice sector.





TRANSITION OF THE JUDICIARY PRO BONO AND PAUPER BRIEFS SCHEME TO THE NATIONAL LEGAL AID SERVICE (NLAS)

The Law Society of Kenya has been closely monitoring the transition of the Judiciary Pro Bono and Pauper Briefs Scheme to the National Legal Aid Service (NLAS). We remain mindful of the significant implications this process has for advocates and access to justice in Kenya. From the onset, the Society has actively participated in the transition process through structured consultations, formal engagements, and direct representation within the governance structures established to oversee the transition. To ensure that the views and concerns of the profession were effectively articulated, the Society nominated two Council Members and the Vice President (self) ; Muthoni Gachara Waweru, Wycklife Oyoo , who were subsequently appointed to serve on the Transition Implementation Committee. Throughout this engagement, we have raised critical concerns regarding the institutional preparedness of NLAS, the necessity of a phased transition, the settlement of outstanding claims owed to advocates, and the opposition to proposed annual accreditation fees. We have also advocated for disciplinary oversight to remain within existing statutory structures and for an enhancement of instruction fees.





YOUNG LAWYERS WALK

On 20th June 2026, young advocates came together at Karura Forest in support of mental wellness, physical fitness, and meaningful connections within the legal fraternity. The initiative underscored that, beyond exercise, the walk provided participants with an opportunity to clear their minds, reduce stress, build resilience, and remind one another that no advocate walks alone.

Held in observance of Men's Mental Health Month, the event reinforced the importance of breaking the silence surrounding mental health and fostering a culture in which seeking support is recognised as a sign of strength rather than weakness. Through every step taken, participants demonstrated a shared commitment to building a legal community founded on compassion, wellness, and solidarity.

The initiative was organised by Effie Sheila Achieng', the official Nairobi Representative and Convener of the Young Lawyers Committee, as part of ongoing efforts to prioritise the well-being, connectedness, and holistic growth of young advocates.





LSK STATEMENT ON THE DENIAL OF ENTRY TO SENIOR COUNSEL MARTHA KARUA TO THE REPUBLIC OF UGANDA

On 22nd June 2026, Senior Counsel Martha Karua safely returned to Kenya following the regrettable denial of entry into Uganda, an incident that has drawn concern across the legal fraternity in East Africa. Upon her arrival, Senior Counsel Karua addressed the media and shared her account of the events, reaffirming the importance of upholding the Rule of Law, access to justice, and the rights of advocates to carry out their professional duties without undue hindrance. The press briefing was also addressed by East Africa Law Society President Ramadhan Abubakar and Law Society of Kenya Council Member Wambugu Wanjohi, who strongly condemned the incident and underscored the need to safeguard the independence of the legal profession, respect regional integration frameworks, and protect the freedoms guaranteed under the East African Community Treaty. The Law Society of Kenya remains steadfast in its commitment to defending the Rule of Law, constitutionalism, and the rights of advocates across the region, while standing in solidarity with all members of the legal fraternity working to advance justice and human rights.

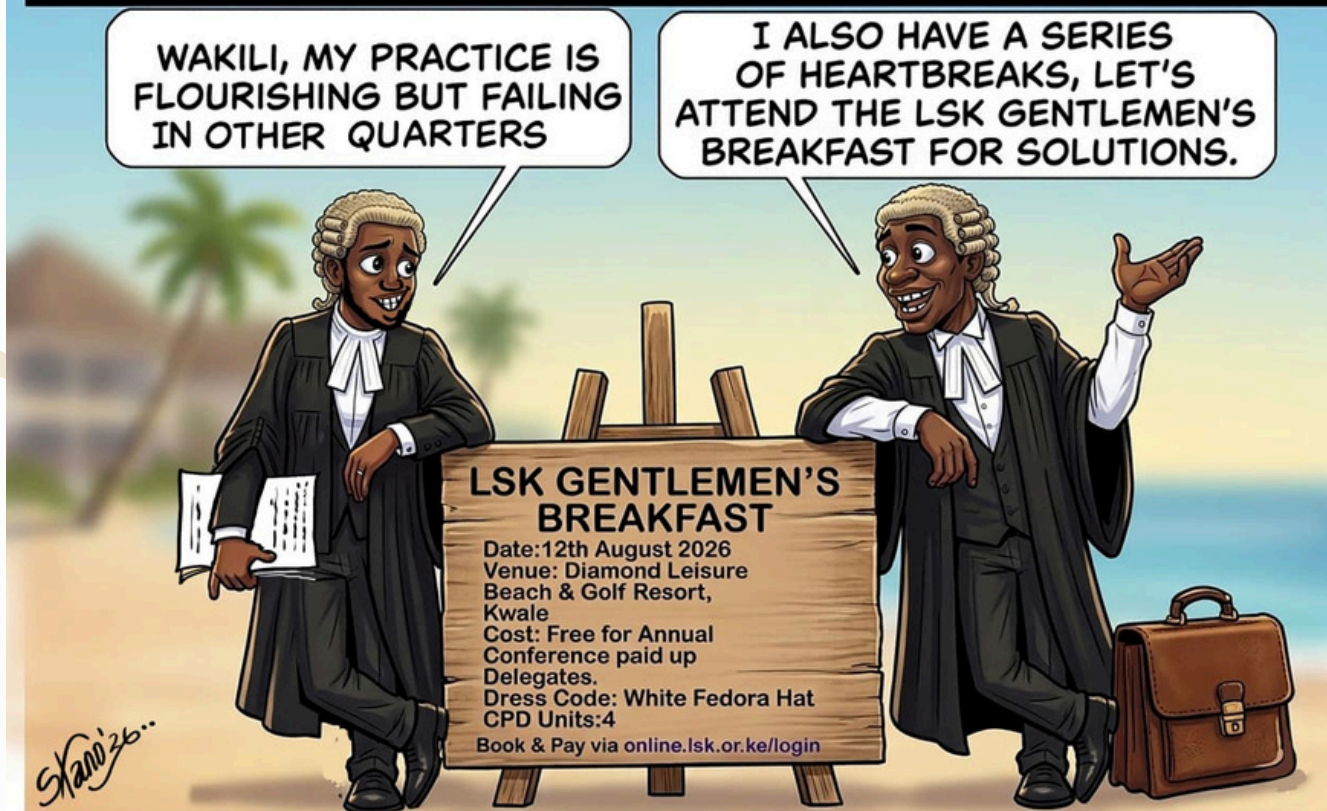
