PRESIDENT'S WEEKLY MESSAGE: DIGNITY OF THE ADVOCATE

In Homer's great epic, the Odyssey, when the main character Odysseus left for the Trojan War, he entrusted his son Telemachus to his wise friend Mentor, who guided, counselled, and protected the boy in his father's absence. The word has carried that meaning for nearly three thousand years. Mentorship is a relationship in which a more experienced, knowledgeable, or wiser person deliberately invests in the growth, development, and guidance of another – typically someone less experienced – for the benefit of that person's personal, professional, or intellectual journey.

This past week the topic of mentorship, and the related matter of the dignity of the advocate, came into sharp focus. On Monday 25th May, 166 new advocates were admitted to the Bar, inspired by the example and promise of a career of dignity in the legal profession. The same afternoon, the Chief Justice welcomed over 100 young advocates into the 3rd CJ's Mentorship Forum, where the topic of mentorship and professional dignity came up. On Friday 29th May, the LSK Council and Branch Chairs met the Judiciary Leadership where the topic of upholding the advocate's professional dignity again featured.

We urged the Judiciary Leadership to remind judges, judicial officers and staff that the Judiciary and the legal profession are two sides of the same coin of access to justice. Developments regarding work injury practice, small claims court, pro-bono legal work, court-annexed mediation, advocates remuneration and technology should not turn into opportunities or reasons to undercut the value of legal work and the dignity of the practising advocate. We agreed to work robustly to facilitate effective legal representation as a core pillar of access to justice. We equally reiterated our joint commitment to root out corruption in both the Bar & the Bench, and to progressively address the pain points affecting justice delivery in Courts and Tribunals.

STATEMENT OF THE LAW SOCIETY OF KENYA ON THE PROPOSED SETTING UP OF AN EBOLA QUARANTINE FACILITY IN KENYA

The Law Society of Kenya has noted with grave concern reports of ongoing discussions regarding the possible establishment of an Ebola quarantine, monitoring or treatment facility within the Republic of Kenya for foreign nationals exposed to or infected with Ebola Virus Disease outside Kenya.

Let us be clear. The Society opposes any such proposal.

Kenya cannot become a holding ground for dangerous infectious diseases outsourced by foreign states seeking to shield their own territories from risk. What another country is unwilling to host within its own borders cannot be transferred onto the people of Kenya without public participation, transparency, parliamentary oversight, biosafety safeguards and full constitutional accountability.

The reported proposal raises serious constitutional, public health, environmental, biosafety and sovereignty concerns. It places at risk the rights of Kenyans under Articles 26, 28, 42 and 43 of the Constitution, including the rights to life, dignity, health and a clean and healthy environment.

The Society is particularly concerned that these discussions appear to have proceeded in secrecy, without public participation, without disclosure of any agreement and without any demonstrated biosafety assessment.

The Law Society of Kenya therefore calls upon the Government of Kenya to immediately halt any discussions, negotiations, approvals or arrangements relating to the establishment

of any Ebola-related quarantine or treatment facility for foreign nationals within Kenyan territory.

Consequently, and in defence of the Constitution and in the public interest, the Society has moved to the High Court under **Nairobi Constitutional Petition No. E334 of 2026; Law Society of Kenya v. Ministry of Health & Others** seeking urgent constitutional intervention in opposition to the proposed arrangement.

The Law Society of Kenya will continue to defend constitutionalism, public accountability and the safety, dignity and well-being of the people of Kenya.

LSK PIL ALERT: COURT UPDATE ON PETITION CHALLENGING PETROLEUM PRICING REGIME - NYAMIRA CONSTITUTIONAL PETITION NO. E007 OF 2026 – LAW SOCIETY OF KENYA VS ENERGY AND PETROLEUM REGULATORY AUTHORITY & OTHERS

Following the update issued earlier, the matter came up yesterday before Hon. Lady Justice T. Cherere in Nyamira for directions. During the mention of the matter, all Respondents entered appearance but had not filed their responses. Counsel for the Respondents informed the Court of the existence of a separate petition filed in Nairobi raising similar constitutional issues on the petroleum pricing regime and levies. While the Law Society of Kenya sought to have the matter heard and determined in Nyamira, the Court directed that the petition be transferred to Nairobi to align with the related proceedings. The matter will now be considered together with HCCHRPET/E309/2026 – Francis Awino vs Energy and Petroleum Regulatory Authority & Others.

The transfer ensures that petitions raising similar issues on the legality of petroleum pricing and levies are handled together for consistency and coherent determination of the constitutional questions. The matter will be mentioned on **2 June 2026** before Hon. Lady Justice R. E. Aburili in Nairobi for further directions. LSK was represented by Wilkins Ochoki.

LSK PIL ALERT: COURT UPDATE ON LSK EBOLA PETITION - NAIROBI HCCHRPET/E334/2026 – LAW SOCIETY OF KENYA VS MINISTRY OF HEALTH & STATE LAW OFFICE & 4 OTHERS

Following the update issued on 28 May 2026, the High Court has now issued directions in the matter filed by the Law Society of Kenya challenging the proposed establishment of a United States Government Ebola quarantine and treatment facility in Kenya. Today, 29th May 2026, the High Court (Hon. Lady Justice R. E. Aburili) declined to certify the LSK petition as urgent, noting that a similar petition, HCCHRPET/E333/2026, had already been filed and placed before Hon. Lady Justice Patricia Nyaundi, SC. In that earlier matter, the Court had certified the case as urgent and issued conservatory orders restraining the establishment and operation of any Ebola-related quarantine or treatment arrangements pending inter partes hearing.

The Court consequently directed that the LSK petition be served upon the respondents and be placed before Hon. Lady Justice Patricia Nyaundi, SC for consideration together with Petition No. E333 of 2026, to ensure consistency in the Court's handling of the issue. The Court recognised that similar orders had already been issued by Hon. Lady Justice Nyaundi, SC in the related matter, effectively maintaining the status quo on the proposed Ebola arrangement pending inter partes hearing. The matter will be mentioned on **2 June 2026** before Hon. Lady Justice Patricia Nyaundi, SC for further directions. LSK was represented by Jacjohn Owino.

LSK PIL ALERT: COURT UPDATE ON BUSINESS AND HUMAN RIGHTS PETITION - NAIROBI HIGH COURT PETITION NO. E296 OF 2026 – JILK CONSTRUCTION COMPANY LTD & OTHERS V. ASAHI GROUP HOLDINGS LTD & OTHERS

The Law Society of Kenya formally appeared in the matter as the 6th Interested Party in what marks the Society's debut in strategic litigation on Business and Human Rights. The Petition arises from the transfer of indirect shareholding in East African Breweries PLC by Diageo PLC to Asahi Group Holdings Ltd. On Monday 25th May 2026, the Society submitted that the United Nations Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights (UNGPs) form part of Kenyan law through Articles 2(5) and 2(6) of the Constitution and Kenya's adoption of the National Action Plan on Business and Human Rights in 2020. LSK further argued that State organs and regulatory authorities are constitutionally obligated to uphold human rights, accountability and the rule of law in commercial and regulatory decision-making. The Court was also urged to consider the State's failure to operationalise the National Action Plan, leaving the Judiciary as the primary avenue for accountability and enforcement in matters involving business and human rights. The Court is scheduled to deliver its ruling on **2 June 2026**. LSK was represented by Wilfred Nderitu, SC.

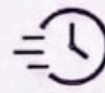

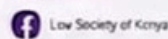

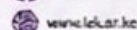

COUNCIL MEETS CHIEF JUSTICE ON SERVICE DELIVERY

On 29 May 2026, the Council of the Law Society of Kenya (LSK), led by President Charles Kanjama SC, together with the caucus of Branch Chairs led Mr. Eric Kivuva, held a follow up Consultative Meeting with the Judiciary, led by Honourable Chief Justice Martha Koome.

The discussion centered on efforts to strengthen access to justice and service delivery within the judiciary and the larger legal profession. The Council reiterated its commitment to transparency, accountability and strengthening justice delivery.

Key issues raised during the meeting included dignity of advocates, transition of the Pro Bono Scheme, concerns on court annexed mediation, corruption in courts and land registries, reforms for the Small Claims Court and undercutting in legal practice. LSK also emphasized the need for capacity building of the Judiciary.

It was agreed to hold structured biannual Bar-Bench meetings going forward to track progress.





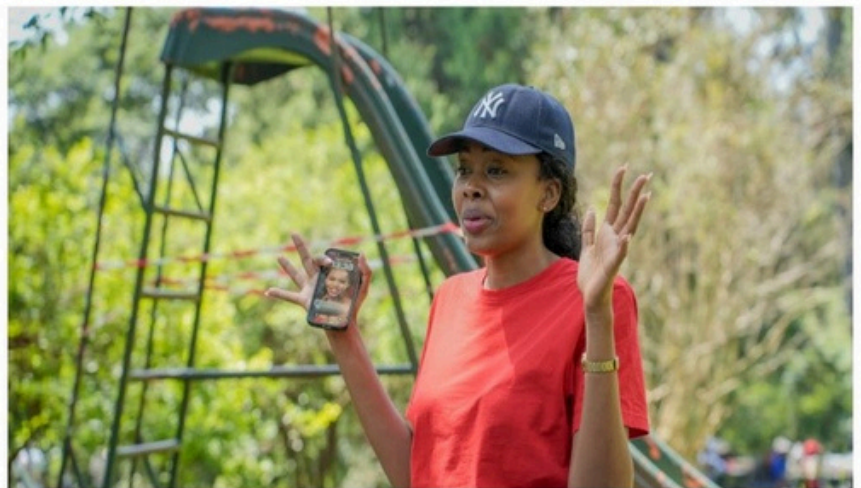
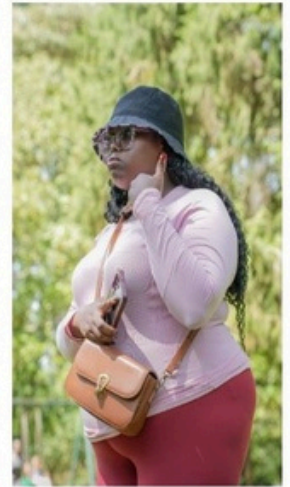
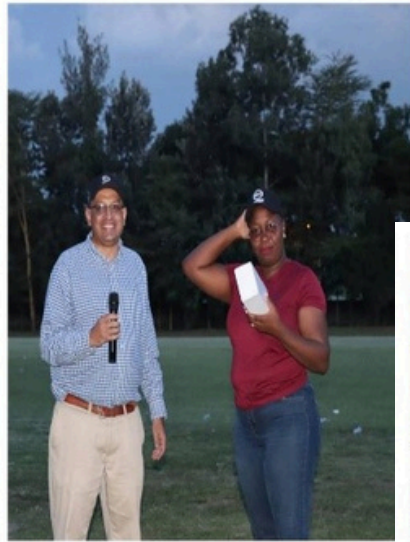
THE ADVOCATES' BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION

The President further encouraged members and stakeholders across the profession to continue supporting initiatives that strengthen the Society's capacity to serve advocates and uphold the administration of justice.



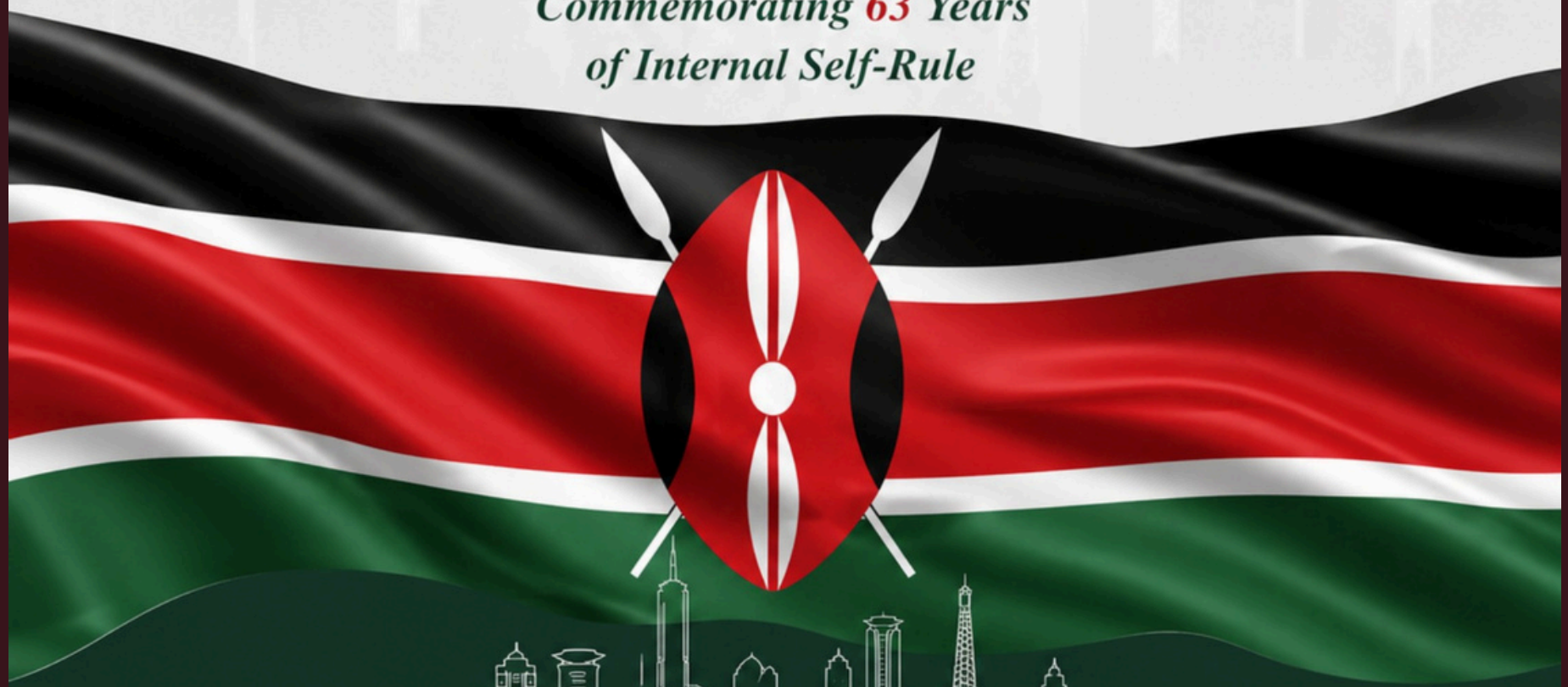
